Dimensions Charge to the Jurors asks them:

"to choose the best among all eligible entries. For our *Dimensions* exhibition, the SCC looks for works with unique, individual expression that transcend technique. They should have content as well as achieving technical and creative excellence."

The *Dimensions Juror's Critique* gives you a glimpse into the thought processes and decision making of this year's two jurors: **Tom McFall** and **June J. Jacobs**. McFall has been the Executive Director of the Alberta Craft Council for over 15 years, one of Canada's largest and most productive craft organizations and has expanded awareness of Alberta's professional craftspeople. Well known textile artist Jacobs has exhibited locally, nationally and internationally. She has been the owner/operator of The Hand Wave Gallery in Meacham, SK for over 29 years.
